The winning entries will then be selected by secret ballot by the Conference delegates and guests. Winner in each category will be awarded a \$50 cash prize.



## HOME & GARDEN RULES & REGULATIONS

- **All exhibitors must purchase admission tickets during event hours**
- One entry per person, per class, unless otherwise stated
- No late entries will be accepted
- All entries must have been grown or made by the exhibitor within the last twelve months and not previously entered at CVEX, unless otherwise stated
- Prize money is \$5.00 for 1<sup>st</sup>, \$3.00 for 2<sup>nd</sup> and a decal for 3<sup>rd</sup> unless otherwise stated
- Any 'Home & Garden' exhibitors removing exhibits in any division of the fairgrounds before 4:15 p.m. Sunday, August 28, without the prior written permission of the Director-in-Charge, shall forfeit all prize money, prizes and deposits. Exhibitor Cards must be presented to the committee-in-charge before any exhibit is removed.
- Sale of raffle tickets at CVEX event is ONLY permitted by special application and approval by CVEX. Organizations are responsible for their own gaming licenses.
- "For Sale" signs are not permitted.
- The Comox Valley Exhibition Association reserves the right to refuse anyone for cause.
- Any exhibitor who violates any of the GENERAL RULES, or any of the rules printed herein, shall be liable to forfeit any or all prize money and awards made to such exhibitor, and may also be barred from further competition for such a period as may be decided by the Directors

## SECTION A – GARDEN PRODUCE – GENERAL DISPLAY RULES

- Ensure that the variety of each exhibit is noted on the exhibit card when the item is received at the Fair.
- Vegetables should be uniform in size, shape and colour and free from blemishes. Their colour should be bright and attractive. Long keeping vegetables should be firm and mature. Cabbage and similar vegetables should be properly trimmed (do not over-trim) and do not enter vegetables past their prime.
- Wash all root vegetables free from soil (do not scrub or buff roots). Leave the stems on as specified.
- It is essential to have the correct number, size and lengths of vegetables on the plate as specified.
- In classes where there is not a minimum or three different exhibitors, exhibits will be judged with a comparable class.
- The Judging on fruit and vegetables will be based upon "BC Council of Garden Clubs Judging Standards". A copy is available for viewing at the CVEX Office during office hours.
- Decals will be placed on all exhibit cards. Ribbons & prize money can be collected at the "Prize Collection Booth"

## SECTION A - GARDEN PRODUCE – DIVISION 1 – VEGETABLES - DISPLAY RULES

<b>Beans</b>	Stems and tips on; select young and uniform pods.
<b>Beets</b>	Trim tops; tap root; display 6, cut one in half. 2 1/2" - 3" diam.
<b>Broccoli</b>	Select firm heads, stems should be approx 7" in length.
<b>Cabbage</b>	Select firm, uniform heads, remove loose outer leaves and stalks.
<b>Carrots</b>	Select straight carrots of same variety; trim tops to 1/2 inch.
<b>Corn</b>	Select well-filled ears; peel back the full length of half the husk on 2 ears.
<b>Cucumbers</b>	Wash and wipe dry to shine them. Long English at least 8" long, pickling 2-3" long.
<b>Garlic</b>	Select well formed bulbs, dry well.
<b>Gourds</b>	Gourds should be firm and free from blemishes. Diverse shapes and colours.
<b>Kale</b>	Remove roots; choose large, numerous, dark well curled leaves. Display in a container of water.
<b>Onions</b>	Dry well, skins to be intact. Uniform colour, shape, size & maturity.
<b>Peas</b>	Large, fresh, uniform pods, free of blemishes filled with large, clean, whole uniform peas of good green colour.
<b>Peppers</b>	Uniform, free of blemishes, stems attached.
<b>Potatoes</b>	Brush soil off; should be representative of variety. Tubers smooth, eyes few and shallow, free of damage.
<b>Pumpkins</b>	Leave stems attached; brush off soil; each pair should be the same variety. Uniform size & shape, blemish free, approx 7" diameter. Flesh thick and with a uniform, attractive colour.
<b>Squash</b>	Leave stems attached; brush off soil; each pair should be the same variety. One summer, one winter.
<b>Tomatoes</b>	Firm; stems left on. For taste test - Colour size and shape do not matter

<b>A-2-1</b>	Fresh herbs, 5 sprigs or branches of different varieties in one container.
<b>A-2-2</b>	Herb garden, minimum of 3 varieties in one container.
<b>A-2-3</b>	Potted herb, 1
<b>A-2-4</b>	Dried herbs, 1 sprig or branch not crushed.
<b>A-2-5</b>	Dried herb collection, 5 sprigs or branches of different varieties in one container.

## SECTION A - GARDEN PRODUCE – DIVISION 3 – CORNSTALKS & SUNFLOWERS

- A-3-1** Cornstalk, tallest (no soil on roots), 1
- A-3-2** Sunflower head, largest (measured across diameter, head only), 1
- A-3-3** Sunflower stalk, tallest (no soil on roots)
- A-3-4** Sunflower, with the most heads per stem - Ribbon and \$10 prize
- A-3-5** Design and create an interesting sunflower garden hat. Judged on creativity. MUST be wearable!
- Rosette Awarded For Best Sunflower In Show*

## SECTION A - GARDEN PRODUCE – DIVISION 4 – SCARECROWS

- A-4-1** Family made
- A-4-2** Kids only
- A-4-3** Adult only
- A-4-4** Business
- A-4-5** Mini Scarecrow (Maximum height 14”) – All ages  
Recycle household materials to create a mini scarecrow to stake or hang in your garden.  
Wire and/or string can be used to construct your project.

## SECTION B - FRUIT – DIVISION 1 – FRUIT

Fruits should be displayed with stems on. Apples should be wiped. Plums should not be wiped. Do not mix and match varieties unless otherwise stated. Be sure to have the right number of fruits on each plate as specified.

## SECTION C - FLOWERS – DISPLAY RULES

- All flowers, unless otherwise instructed, must be placed in the containers supplied by the CVEX. Arrangements and designs are exempt.
  - An arrangement is to consist of fresh cut plants.
  - A centerpiece is to be small, medium, or large. A design may include other materials like dried flowers or a basket.
  - Bouquet: small under 10”, medium up to 20”, large over 20” measured in height and width, viewable from all sides, any combination of flowers.
  - Flowers are judged on the basis of freshness in the stem and foliage, the brilliance of colour, and the freedom from insect spray or damage. The size of the flowers should be suitable for the container i.e. large containers should have similarly large flowers. Be sure that the containers you have chosen for arrangements DO NOT LEAK.
  - In classes where there is 3 or less exhibits, exhibits will be judged with a comparable class

## SECTION C – FLOWERS - DIVISION 1 – FLOWER ARRANGEMENTS

- C-1-1 Centerpiece - small, medium, large
- C-1-2 Wedding arrangement. Your choice - eg. Brides bouquet, flower girl, table arrangement.
- C-1-3 Unusual Container - arrangement using unusual container.
- C-1-4 Novice Class - An arrangement entered by someone who has not previously won a ribbon
- C-1-5 Tea cup arrangement - special day or seasonal arrangement (Christmas, birthdays, etc.)
- C-1-6 Japanese Cut Flower Arrangement.
- C-1-7 Miniature Flower Arrangement (max. 5" diameter)
- C-1-8 Bouquet of flowers, small, medium, or large
- C-1-9 A basket of Dahlias
- C-1-10 Dried Flower Arrangement
- C-1-11 A dried arrangement of flowers, grasses, etc. The arrangement is required to have no less than 7 types of flowers or grasses. No commercial ornaments allowed. Arrangement not to be more than 3' high and 3' wide, and not less than 1' by 1'. Container of your choice may be used.
- C-1-12 CVEX Design - a design with fruit, flowers, veggies, grain, branches, etc. Anything goes in this one.
- C-1-13 Roadside, seaside, or woodland arrangement or design. Let your imagination and creativity flow. No limits as to the materials used and gathered, e.g. Wildflowers, shells, foliage, pebbles are all allowed. Please label as much as possible.

- Eggs are to be presented in carton of one dozen unless otherwise stated.
- In classes where there is not a minimum of three different exhibitors, exhibits will be judged with a comparable class.

- All exhibits of honey and wax (except granulated honey) must be the production of the exhibitor for the current year.
- All comb honey must be wrapped in cellophane or Ross round containers.
- If the articles exhibited are of inferior quality, the judge will award only such prizes as they deem the exhibits merit. The judges are particularly requested to conform to this regulation.
- In classes where there is not a minimum of three different exhibitors, exhibits will be judged with a comparable class.
